## Dan to Beersheba Tour (*Anakim Version*)

<b>Day 1</b>	<b><i>Joppa &amp; the Rebirth of Israel</i></b> Arrive Tel Aviv in the morning; Grab a coffee & head to ancient Joppa, the site of Jonah's ill-fated boat ride & Peter's vision. Then check out Independence Hall, the site of the rebirth of the nation of Israel in 1948. Enjoy a welcome to Israel dinner at the hotel and rest up for the beginning of your adventure! (overnight in Tel Aviv)
<b>Day 2</b>	<b><i>The Judean Wilderness</i></b> Depart Israel for the Valley of Elah to see where David fought Goliath, then retreat to the nearby cave of Adullam. Be refreshed at the wells of Beersheba, and finish the day on a camel ride in the Negev desert. Enjoy a traditional Bedouin meal before turning in for the evening (overnight in Negev Desert)
<b>Day 3</b>	<b><i>The Negev &amp; the Red Sea</i></b> Drive through the wilderness of Zin as you make your way down to the Red Sea. Watch out for tanks and fighter jets training in the Negev desert! Stop at Timna park, & explore a life-size replica of the Tabernacle. Cap the day off with some snorkeling in the Red Sea along the coral reef (overnight in Eilat)
<b>Day 4</b>	<b><i>The Dead Sea</i></b> Drive north through the wilderness of Paran to the lowest place on Earth, the Dead Sea! Walk the salt flats or float in this unique lake. Head over to Tel Arad to see a magnificent fortress & an even better view (overnight in Arad)
<b>Day 5</b>	<b><i>The Judean Wilderness, Part II</i></b> Begin your day by climbing the ramp the Romans built to besiege Masada; Hunt for brimstone nearby, & be refreshed at the lush springs of En Gedi, where David hid from Saul; Check out the caves of Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found; stop by the Baptismal Site near Jericho before finishing the day where the walls came a-tumblin' down: Jericho! (overnight in Jericho)
<b>Day 6</b>	<b><i>Up to Jerusalem</i></b> Get your first view of the Old City from the Mount of Olives; From there, travel down to the garden of Gethsemane for a special time of reflection. Spend some time at the Garden Tomb, where you can view Golgotha & walk into the empty tomb! Visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Museum, as well as the Bible Lands Museum before turning in for the evening. (overnight in Jerusalem)

**"Come and See!"**

<b>Day 7</b>	<b><i>The Old City of Jerusalem</i></b> Ascend the holiest place in Judaism, the Temple Mount; then descend into the Western Wall Tunnels to the original road that led to the Temple from the north. Next, learn about the preparations in place for the next Temple at the Temple Institute; Discover the City of David, where you can explore Hezekiah's tunnel, with water fed by the Gihon spring that leads to the pool of Siloam. Discover the pool of Bethesda, the Upper Room, and King David's Tomb. End the day with a special presentation by a modern-day Torah scribe at the hotel, & learn how the Bible was written...& still is today! (overnight in Jerusalem)
<b>Day 8</b>	<b><i>Judea &amp; Samaria</i></b> Go where few tours will take you, to the biblical territories of Judea & Samaria (the modern day "West Bank"). Visit Shiloh, the final home of Tabernacle; See Bethel, where Jacob had his vision of the ladder; Ascend Mount Gerizim & biblical Shechem before traveling into the Galilee (overnight in Tiberias)
<b>Day 9</b>	<b><i>The Jezreel Valley</i></b> Visit a kibbutz along the Jordan River; see the magnificent ruins of Betshean, where the bodies of Saul & Jonathan were taken; Travel down the road to the spring where Gideon's army was reduced to 300 men; Get your first view of the Jezreel Valley at Tel Yizreel, where Ahab made his home; See the ancient battleground site of Megiddo before heading back in time 2,000 years to see what Nazareth was like (overnight in Tiberias)
<b>Day 10</b>	<b><i>The Galilee</i></b> Stand near the oldest known synagogue in Israel where Jesus preached at Magdala; See the ruins of Peter's hometown in Capernaum; Ascend the Mount of Beatitudes overlooking the Sea; Hike up to Susita, the home of the maniac of Gadera; Finish the day sailing the waters of the Galilee on a wooden boat (overnight in Tiberias)
<b>Day 11</b>	<b><i>The Golan Heights</i></b> Travel to the northern hills of Israel and see the site where Jeroboam set up an altar at Tel Dan; stand where the Messiah asked, "Whom do men say that I the Son of man am?" at Caesarea Philippi; Peer into Lebanon & Syria from the famous battleground of Tel Facher (overnight in Tiberias)
<b>Day 12</b>	<b><i>The Mediterranean Sea</i></b> Head west & ascend two great biblical mountains. First, Mount Tabor, the sight of Deborah & Barak; then on to Mount Carmel, where Elijah had a showdown with the prophets of Baal, with an incredible view of the Jezreel Valley; Stop by the famous aqueduct built by King Herod on your way to the seaside palaces of Caesarea, where Philip, Peter, & Paul all spent some time; From there, you'll be transferred back to the airport in Tel Aviv to prepare for your overnight flight.
